29th Carving Championship- Resounding Success

The 2015 Prairie Canada Carving Championship was held April 18 & 19 at Canad Inns Polo Park and attracted 292 wood, bone, stone and antler carvings from 103 carvers, along with a smattering of turnings. An additional 120 carvings graced a new feature exhibit area that showcased the work and collections of Bert Bodnaruk (caricatures), Matt Dedrick (spear fishing decoys), Ernie Fox (historic working duck decoys) and Randy Warren (stone carvings). Thank you gents- your efforts are greatly appreciated.

Judges were put to the test Saturday with the high caliber and sheer number of entriesthanks goes out to Lana Cowell, Ray England, Sylvain Marin, Tory Neald, Sean Nicol, Brian Parker, Peter Sawatzky, Jill Town, Ruben Unger and Larry Vanderhyde. Members of Les Gens de Bois Woodcarving Club, Adanac Carvers Association, the Woodturners Association of Manitoba, the Oak Hammock Marsh Carvers Guild and the Manitoba Wildlife Haven Rehabilitation Organization captivated the interests of visitors, adding to the ambiance of the show. The Prairie Canada Carvers' Association was pleased to present Harry Williams and Larry Vanderhyde, residents of Winnipeg, with the *Carver's Award of Excellence* for their achievements in promoting and engendering the art of carving. Peter Sawatzky of Glenboro crafted the special *Carver's* bronze award and presented them April 17 at the banquet. Harry and Larry share a passion for teaching and mentoring carvers in a constructive and fulfilling way. Harry excels in carving working duck decoys and Larry specializes in decorative ducks. Both men are highly regarded in the carving community and have been vigorous supporters of the carving community.

Harry has been running decoy classes sponsored by Ducks Unlimited Canada for over 15 years. Over the winter months he and members of the Oak Hammock Marsh Carvers Guild conduct a series of three day decoy carving workshops at the Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive entre. In addition Harry, over the course of 12 years, assisted Dr. Frank Baldwin with Ducks Unlimited annual Great Greenwing Adventure where decoy carving was part of the week long youth-oriented activity.

Harry has donated hundreds of his carvings to Ducks Unlimited Canada fundraising dinners, the Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre and many other charitable events, resulting in thousands of dollars being raised for worthy causes. His distinctive working duck decoys are well known and sought after by collectors.

He served on the board of PCCA for five years and is a founding member of the Oak Hammock Marsh Carving Guild which began in 2000. He has been a tireless worker on behalf of the Guild in recruiting members, offering workshops, running an annual competition and promoting outreach activities.

In addition he has judged waterfowl at the Saskatoon Wildlife Art Competition.
